From Pastor Ed...

Jesus prayed, "Holy Father, I'm praying for my followers, because my life is on display in them. Guard them as they pursue this life. I'm praying also for those who will believe in me because of their witness. The goal is for them all to become one heart and mind." John 17

Dear Friends.

As Jesus prayed that night, he was anticipating the way that his gospel would spread after he was gone, and the reaction the world would have to it. His prayer has some excellent guidance for his Church when it comes to reaching out to the world.

One way that the Church often gets derailed is when we put way too much emphasis on our traditions – and the battles that get waged over them. Notice that Jesus said, that it wouldn't be the *ideas* or the *liturgies* of the Church that the world would react to - it would be to the way people's lives were changing, by virtue of the difference Christ made in their lives. In other words, when people can see God's love and mercy and grace on display in our lives - it is *that* difference that the world notices and reacts to one way or another.

It also looks like Jesus anticipated that we'd get caught up in controversies with each other in the Church, when we look at the next portion of his prayer. Jesus asked that God would help us to be united in heart and mind. This is a prayer for unity. But when we read the surrounding verses, Jesus is praying for a unity based on our *relation-ships*, not on creeds, or worship styles, or traditions. Jesus prayed for us to be united - *with* all our differences. The only way that is even possible is if it's based on our devotion to Christ, and the power of His Spirit. It must come from the new heart that is given to us by God. (Jer.31: 33) It must come from the promise that Jesus always provides the grace I need to fulfill what he asks of me – in this case: "to love one another *as he loves me.*" (John 13:34)

The truth Jesus was getting at, is that it's our relationships that transform us in the church, not our religion. It is the way we relate to God and each other that empowers our life together and our mission. This is why there has been several attempts in the last two years to create more small groups! People who may not come to church may come to a small group, where they can hear the stories and real life concerns of people they know, whose lives have been changed by Christ.

The promise is that whenever and wherever people can see God's love, God's life in us, *that* is when we're on the Way towards being living *answers* to Jesus' prayer for the witness of His Church.

The first session will be at 12:30 pm on Sunday, September 29 at the church in the little chapel. Those in attendance can determine the best time, day of the week, and frequency for subsequent sessions.

I have a great idea how to kick it off, I think!

There are quite a few people feeling loss and grief right now. Where this group goes can be determined by you and the other attendees.

I'll start off by practicing vulnerability (aka: sharing with others, honesty) and sitting with the feelings for both those coming to the session and for the facilitators (who most likely will be each of us as we listen). No platitudes. No answers. (Rats!) Lots of listening and hopefully sharing in a safe space.

We will be looking at loss in its many forms: death, death of a dream, death of a relationship...that sort of thing. I hope you can make it!
